**D'ith.** D'ith mé ar maidin é.  
**Nár ith** tú an císte?  
**Níor ith.** D'ith Máire é.  
Did you eat the cake?  
Yes. I ate it in the morning.  
Didn't you eat the cake?  
No. Mary ate it.
2. **Ar chuala** tú an scéal?  
**Chuala.** Bhí an-áthas orm.  
**Nár chuala** tú an scéal?  
**Níor chuala.** Níor chuala mé faic.  
Did you hear the news?  
Yes. I was very happy.  
Didn't you hear the news?  
No. I didn't hear anything.

**Tháinig.** Bhí tuirse orm.

Yes. I like it a lot.  
Didn't you take it with you?  
No. I don't like it.
5. **An ndearna** tú an císte sin?  
**Rinne.** Nach bhfuil sé blásta?  
**Nach ndearna** tú an císte sin?  
**Ní dhearna.** Ní maith liom císte.  
Did you make that cake?  
Yes. Isn't it tasty?  
Didn't you make that cake?  
No. I don't like cake.
6. **An ndeachaigh** tú abhaile?  
**Chuaigh.** Bhí ocras orm.  
**Nach ndeachaigh** tú abhaile?  
**Ní dheachaigh.** D'fhan mé anseo.  
Did you go home?  
Yes. I was hungry.  
Didn't you go home?  
No. I stayed here.
7. **An bhfaca** tú mo mhadra?  
**Chonaic.** Bhí sé sa ghairdín.  
**Nach bhfaca** tú mo mhadra?  
**Ní fhaca.** Ní raibh sé anseo.  
Did you see my dog?  
Yes. It was in the garden.  
Didn't you see my dog?  
No. It wasn't here.
8. **An bhfuair** tú mo litir?  
**Fuair.** Fuair mé inné í.  
**Nach bhfuair** tú mo litir?  
**Ní bhfuair.** Ní raibh mé sa bhaile.  
Did you get my letter?  
Yes. I got it yesterday.  
Didn't you get my letter?  
No. I wasn't at home.
9. **An ndúirt** tú é sin le Seán?  
**Dúirt.** Bhí fearg orm inné.  
**Nach ndúirt** tú é sin le Seán?  
**Ní dúirt.** Ní dúirt mé faic leis.  
Did you say that to Seán?  
Yes. I was angry yesterday.  
Didn't you say that to Seán?  
No. I didn't say anything to him.
