Lesson Three Verbs – III (The Past Tense)

The Past Tense ($An \ Aimsir \ Chaite$) is used for describing events that already happened. The past tense is formed by leniting the first letter of the command form of the verb. If the verb starts with a vowel or f, then d' is placed in front of the positive form of the past tense verb.

Chuir mé an leabhar ar an mbord. I **put** the book on the table.

D'ól mé an bainne. I **drank** the milk.

Cheannaigh sé an carr gorm. He bought the blue car. D'oscail sí an doras. She opened the door.

It is possible to use the analytic form of the verb with all persons (requiring a noun or pronoun to follow the verb), but a synthetic form is commonly used for the "we" form.

Chuireamar an leabhar ar an mbord. **We put** the book on the table.

D'ólamar an bainne.We drank the milk.Cheannaíomar an carr gorm.We bought the blue car.D'osclaíomar an doras.We opened the door.

Negative statements are made by putting *níor* in front of the verb.

Níor chuir mé an leabhar ar an mbord. I **didn't put** the book on the table.

Níor ól mé an bainne. I didn't drink the milk. Níor osclaíomar an doras. We didn't open the door.

A positive question is made by putting *ar* in front of the verb.

Ar chuir tú an leabhar ar an mbord? **Did you put** the book on the table?

Ar ól siad an bainne?

Did they drink the milk?

Ar osclaíomar an doras?

Did we open the door?

A negative question is made by putting *nár* in front of the verb.

Nár chuir tú an leabhar ar an mbord? **Didn't you put** the book on the table?

Nár ól siad an bainne?

Didn't they drink the milk?

Nár osclaíomar an doras?

Didn't we open the door?

Irish does not have specific words for "yes" or "no". To answer a yes/no type question in the past tense, you repeat the positive or negative form of the verb without any following noun or pronoun.

Ar oscail tú an doras? **Did you open** the door?

D'oscail.Yes (opened).Níor oscail.No (didn't open).

Six irregular verbs (bí, téigh, déan, feic, abair, faigh) use *ní* for negatives and *an* and *nach* for questions.

Ní raibh mé sa bhaile.I wasn't at home.An bhfaca tú an cat?Did you see the cat?Nach ndeachaigh sé le Síle?Didn't he go with Sheila?

The impersonal verb (saorbhriathar) is often used in the past to avoid saying who did an action.

Osclaíodh an doras ag a hocht. The door **was opened** at eight.
